- Sign up as a group of three by scanning the QR code:




Limited to the first 50 groups only!

- 2 Write a composition of at least 150 words about **a change for the better**.

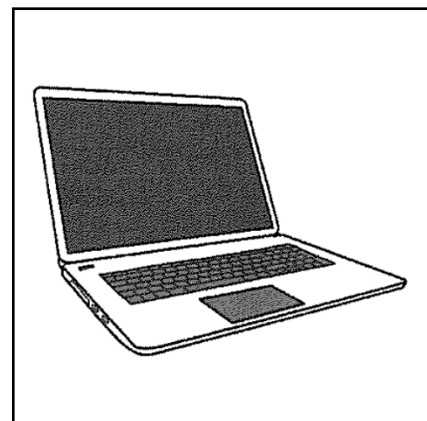
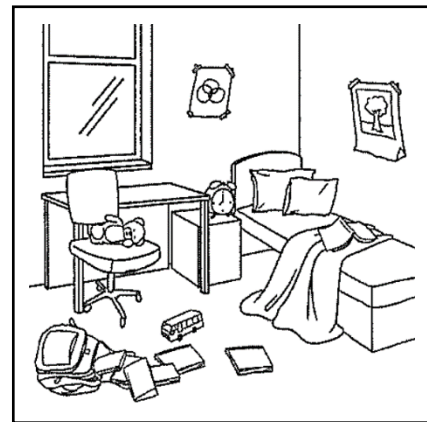
The pictures are provided to help you think about this topic.

Consider the following points when you plan your composition:

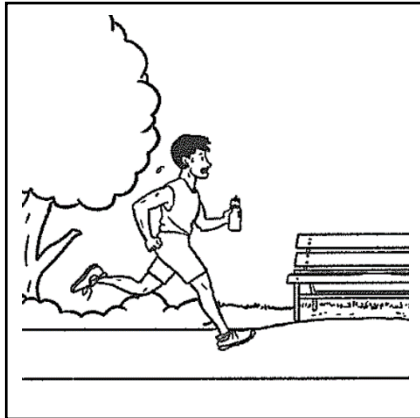
- What was the change?

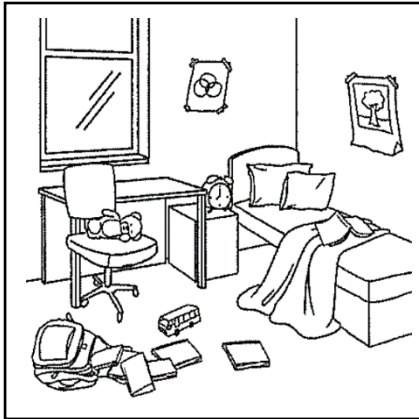
