Chris Hughes. That early site was designed as something of a game comparing

launched on February 4, 2004. Originally just open to Harvard students, the site
soon expanded to Columbia, Yale, and Stanford, then the rest of the Ivy League and

for college students has become something that everyone, from teens to

taking over other social media platforms like WhatsApp and Instagram,
